Ufd104. Crave Hall Meadow (0.6 ha) TL 532444

This small field is one of very few grasslands remaining in the extreme north of the district. The principal grasses are Crested Dog's-tail (*Cynosurus cristatus*), Cock's-foot (*Dactylis glomerata*), Red Fescue (*Festuca rubra*), Meadow Fescue (*Festuca pratensis*), Yorkshire Fog (*Holcus lanatus*), Smooth Meadow-grass (*Poa pratensis*) and Yellow Oat-grass (*Trisetum flavescens*). Within this sward Greater Knapweed (*Centaurea scabiosa*), Knapweed Broomrape (*Orobanche elatior*), Field Scabious (*Knautia arvensis*), Hoary Plantain (*Plantago media*) and Cowslip (*Primula veris*) have been recorded.
