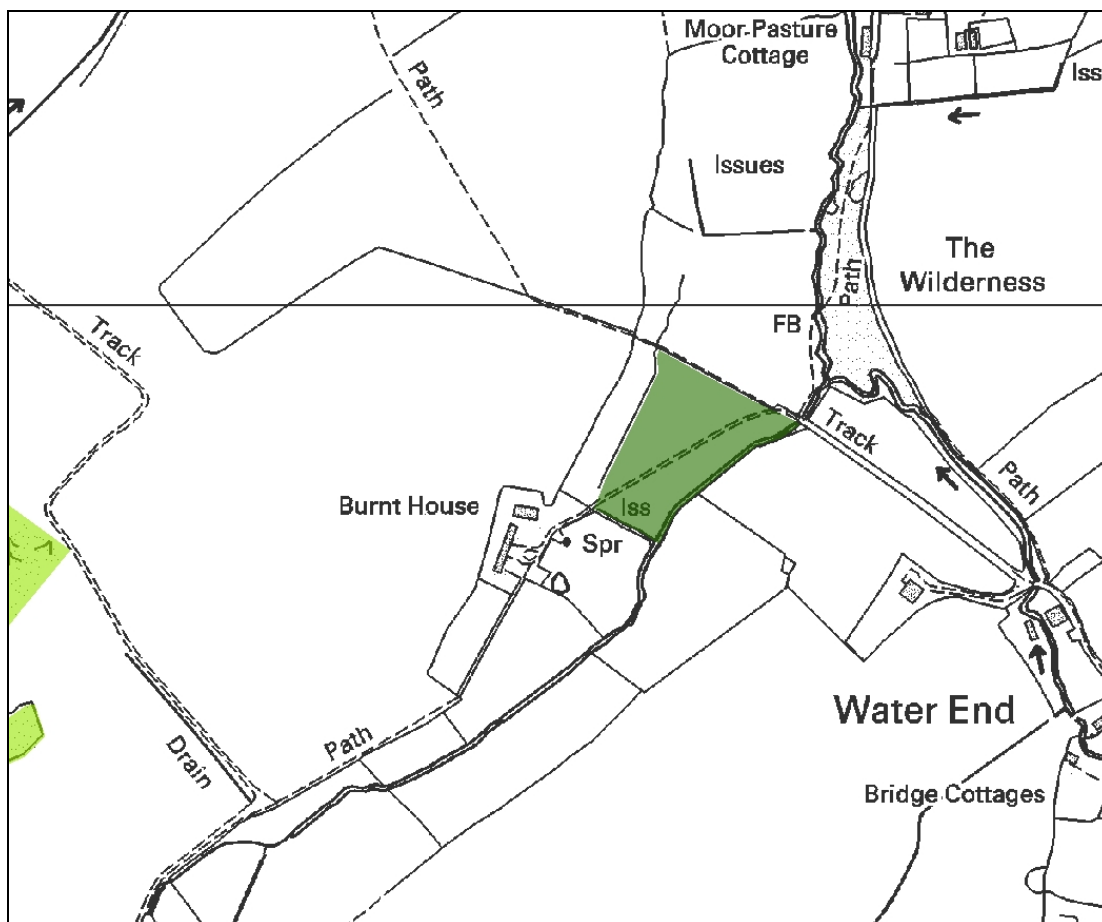

Ufd182. Burnt House Meadow (0.8 ha) TL 584408

Burnt House Meadow comprises grazed chalky clay grassland, now a rare Essex habitat. The sward is characterised by Bent-grasses (*Agrostis* spp.), Sweet Vernal Grass (*Anthoxanthum odoratum*), Red Fescue (*Festuca rubra*), Cock's-foot (*Dactylis glomerata*), Meadow-grasses (*Poa* spp.) and Downy Oat-grass (*Helictotrichon pubescens*). Typical herbs include Salad Burnet (*Sanguisorba minor*), Lady's Bedstraw (*Galium verum*), Cowslip (*Primula veris*), Bulbous Buttercup (*Ranunculus bulbosus*) and Greater Knapweed (*Centaurea scabiosa*).
